



- We acknowledge:
 - The leadership of teachers in the classrooms
 - The responsibility of each student for his or her academic effort

- Founded by a group of like-minded parents
- Opened in 1999; 2nd charter school in the AASD at the time
- 1st classical school in Wisconsin



- Public, tuition-free school
- Created through a contract or "charter" between the governing body of the school and the school district
- Offer an educational choice that varies from neighborhood schools and other charter schools
- In Wisconsin, charter school students take the same state-mandated tests as other public school students and benefit from licensed teachers



- Initiated by the Greeks and Romans over 2000 years ago
 - Links our modern world experience with the great thinkers of the past who mentally grappled with the very same human concerns
- Based on a methodical approach to education, the Trivium, developed in the Middle Ages
 - Consists of three stages of learning that coincide with the development of a child
 - Grammar Stage (grades K 4)

 - Rhetoric Stage (grades 9 12)



- Classical School is a charter school in the Appleton Area School District (AASD)
- 490 students in grades K 8; two classrooms per grade
- Participate in 7th & 8th grade athletics with Einstein Middle School
- Musical ensemble offerings:
 - Orchestra beginning in 4th grade
 - Band beginning in 6th grade and
 - Choir beginning in 7th grade



- Variety of other activities: mythology club, chess club, forensics, ski club, student council, running club, and many more
- Students choose their high school from North, East, or West high schools without having to go through the open enrollment process
- No transportation (bussing) is provided

What Distinguishes Classical School?

- Our content-rich curriculum
- Our time-honored educational practices
- Our committed K-8 community



- Similar to most charter schools we choose to be here, families and staff working together toward common goals
- Involvement from parents is integral to the success of students and the school:
 - Reinforce their children's growth
 - Ensure homework is complete
 - Supplement learning at home
 - Support the teacher and school
 - Volunteer at school 20-hours per year/family
 - Respect the teachers and staff



- Core Knowledge® (CK) sequence:
 - Developed by the Core Knowledge® Foundation
 - Outline of specific content to be taught at each grade level
 - Covers language arts, history, geography, mathematics, science, and the fine arts
- World language instruction (Spanish daily, Greek/Latin vocabulary exposure beginning in kindergarten)

Time-honored Educational Practices

- Academic rigor
- Classical Trivium-based learning stages
 - School of Grammar (grades K 4)
 - Teacher-led instruction
 - Skill-based groupings in reading and math
 - School of Logic (grades 5 8)
 - Socratic method of discussion and questioning
 - Study of logic
 - Latin graduating honors for grades 7 and 8
- Other time-honored program elements
 - Grammar and spelling instruction beginning in first grade
 - Cursive handwriting instruction beginning in third grade
 - Letter grades are awarded beginning in second grade



- Students are expected to strive for excellence.
- Homework there will be homework, more for some students than others
- Participation in class students become comfortable answering questions and talking in front of classmates
- Logic and Greek/Latin are rigorous subjects; however, they are both favorites of many students
 - different and challenging = interesting



- Classes begin at 8:00 am and conclude at 2:49 pm (7:50 am – 3:00 pm for grades 7 and 8)
- Reading instruction begins in kindergarten
 - Taught using Direct Instruction method to develop a common base
 - Goal is to produce readers capable of comprehending unabridged classical literature in later grades
- Saxon Math is used to deliver the math standards in the CK sequence for grades K – 8
- Reading and math programs rely heavily on worksheets in grades K – 3 and are grouped by skill level, which is determined by placement testing



- Spanish is taught for 25 30 minutes daily (45 minutes daily in grades 7 & 8)
 - Instruction is delivered in Spanish
 - Begin by learning vocabulary and grammar to build upon in later grades
- Greek/Latin vocabulary exposure begins in kindergarten
- Daily class time is utilized to cover additional areas outlined in the CK sequence
- Instruction includes physical education, art, and music scheduled throughout the week



- Kindergarten:
 - Kindergarten Orientation Packet on website
 - Math, reading, penmanship
 - Tying shoes, zipping coats
 - Summer School Kindergarten Readiness
- All grades:
 - Preview Core Knowledge® sequence
 - Read literature identified in the sequence or on summer reading list
 - Schedule classroom observation time



- Application period: December 1 February 16
 - Applications in English, Hmong, and Spanish are available outside the office and online
 - Applications received after February 16 are processed in the order in which they are received
- The lottery is held by the end of February,
 - Families are notified of their enrollment or waiting list status by mid-March.
